

Preventing Lead in Drinking Water | Compliance with EPA's REVISED Lead & Copper Rule

In December 2021, the EPA revised the Lead & Copper Rule (originally established in 1991) to better protect children and communities from the risk of lead exposure. Fortunately, Metro Water Services (MWS) has a successful lead program, which began in 1992, that already complies with many of the revisions. It is important to know that Nashville's drinking water does not contain lead when it leaves the treatment plants but tap water can accumulate trace amounts of lead through the corrosion of plumbing materials containing lead.

To be fully compliant with the EPA's revisions MWS must have an updated inventory of the public and private portions of the service line. The property owner—not MWS—owns the water service line from the meter to the home,

therefore some MWS records may need to be updated.

To update their records MWS is asking residents to complete a Service Line Survey. The survey will provide necessary information about the private portion of the water service line.



Project 35. Updates to Brookmeade Park: Install pickleball courts, playground equipment, and an accessible path, and extend water and electrical service to the playground. (\$1,400,000; SVI 3)


